PROGRAM

Our lives are closely embedded in natural ecosystem processes. Humans have always interfered with ecosystem dynamics, but rising human population growth and unprecedented technical progress over the past decades have turned many ecosystems into man-made systems, for instance by converting woodland into farmland on a large scale, or, more dramatically, into shopping centres and parking lots.

Many systems have been changed beyond the tipping point, where system restoration is practically impossible. This is alarming, given the fact that we still do not entirely understand how ecosystems work and how they are embedded in global cycles. We accept only reluctantly scientific knowledge on how much our lives and the lives of our children depend on linked global natural processes and functioning ecosystems.

The festive symposium on Land Use Ecology will focus on anthropogenic pressure on ecosystems and the ways in which they sustain human wellbeing, and will highlight the connections between these systems and various current societal challenges. Renowned international experts will discuss the need for systems-based and interdisciplinary scientific approaches to provide solutions for sustainable land use.
