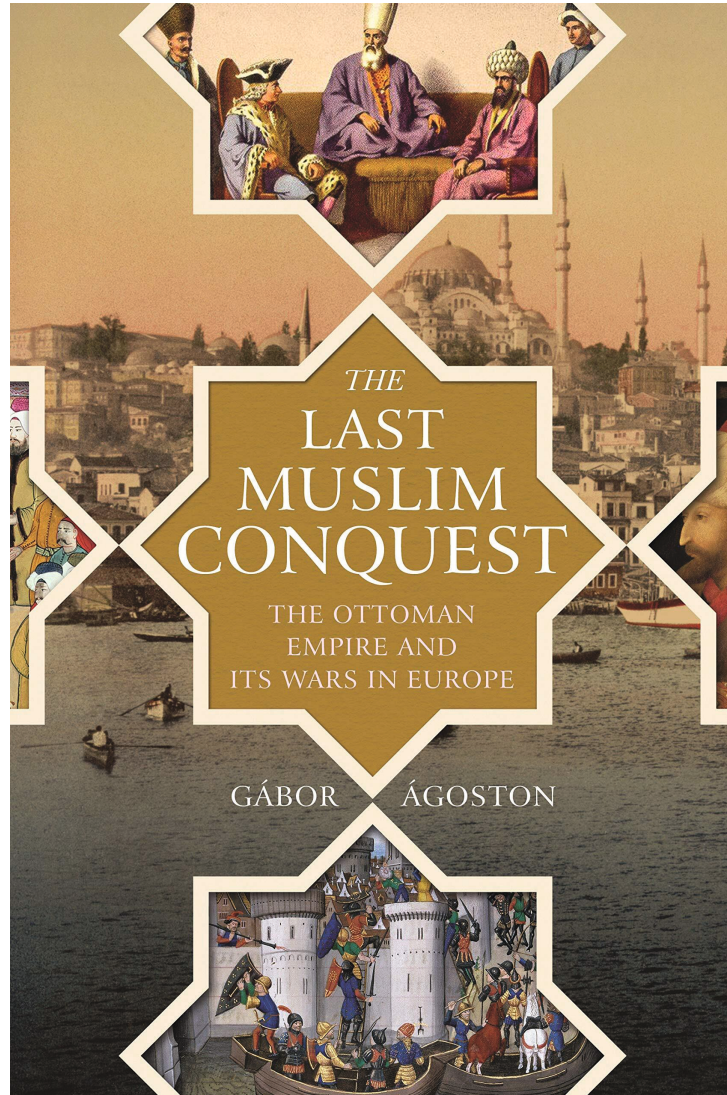

Gábor Ágoston is a Professor of History at Georgetown University, where he teaches courses on Ottoman and Middle Eastern history, the Balkans, and the Black Sea. He is also the author of *Guns for the Sultan: Military Power and the Weapons Industry in the Ottoman Empire* (Cambridge UP, 2005). In addition to four Hungarian-language books, he has published three volumes of collected studies in Turkish and more than a hundred scholarly articles and book chapters in English, Hungarian, and Turkish on Ottoman, Habsburg, and Hungarian warfare, frontiers, diplomacy, and espionage. He is also the co-author of the first English-language *Encyclopedia of the Ottoman Empire* (Facts-on-File, 2009) and co-editor of the upcoming volume 3 of *The Cambridge History of War*.
